Hey friends and family of FHATC, my name is Jesse McGaffee and I'm in the role of Campus Pastor at the ranch. In early December our program took part in a Christmas party for the Adult and Teen Challenge programs in the Nor/Cal Nevada District. We gathered together to sing, perform skits, laugh, worship, pray, grow, and celebrate Jesus together. I'd like to share with you some of my favorite moments from this amazing event.

Moment 1 - Our team was blessed to lead the main worship time before the rest of the acts and as we were practicing many of the

Moment 3 - Our guys were the final act of the night before the main speaker. They performed a skit about Elisha and the servant whose eyes were opened to see the angels surrounding them. From the opening pose to the closing remarks we laughed and were challenged to let God open our eyes.

Moment 4 - The main speaker of our event was Dean Johnson. He began with him and a friend turning the music up to an ungodly loud volume and then proceeded to break bats, bend pans, crush cans, and more. Our guys were on their feet cheering on these feats of strength. Dean and his team gave their testimonies of what God saved them from. We heard from a former gang member who tried to murder someone and God stopped the gun from firing. We heard from Dean about how God took him from an all star athlete who was empty on the inside to his experience of meeting Jesus and being filled with the Holy Spirit. Dean gave an alter call and all of our guys responded to what God was doing. A small group of our men experienced the love and power of God like never before. As one man was coming back to the seats I gave him a hug and he melted in my arms and continued to weep. Another man was touched with healing in his feet. Another was filled with joy. Another was filled with the forgiveness of the Lord. As we closed the event, there was a short testimony time. Most of the testimonies were from our guys. It is obvious to me that the Holy Spirit is on the move in the lives of these men.
