"Last chance ranch" changed my heart of stone into some thing I really always wanted. To be free from when I was young to find and have a joy to lead with love and care for other people.

Only through dedicating myself to the study offered on the ranch was I able to understand what I could finally see. There's just so much to say but I could tell you this. FHTC offered me the challenge to change. Allowing me me to do things I thought would never happen. Jesus' love for us can not be measured. He has done so much in my life. He has lit a path so I can see. I'm not alone, the best is still ahead.
